# Wastewater (Septic) Treatment Installation Guide for Homeowners

## 1st STEP

- <u>Homeowner</u> fills out Permit Application form and returns it with fee (\$200) to Union County Environmental Health Office
- <u>Homeowner</u> uses Provider Sheet to select a provider to complete soil analysis/perc test.
- <u>Homeowner</u> arranges to have the soil analysis/perc test completed by professional soil scientist or registered professional engineer
- <u>Homeowner</u> hires a Licensed Engineer to design the system if home is <u>more</u> than 6 bedrooms or 900 gallons per day.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> STEP

- Union County Environmental Health Office receives a copy of the soil analysis/ perc test & Engineer design if required
- Union County Environmental Health Office conducts a site evaluation
- Union County Environmental Health Office issues homeowner a permit to build (homeowner receives a packet of information with system requirements and approved permit)

## 3rd STEP

- <u>Homeowner</u> selects a registered contactor to build the system (or homeowner plans to build themselves-and they have completed required classes and submitted documentation)
- If <u>alternative system</u> requires maintenance contact- <u>Homeowner</u> selects a maintenance provider and supplies Union County Environmental Health Office with a copy of the contact
- Union County Environmental Health Office conducts a pre-construction meeting with the contractor and or the homeowner to go over requirements

# 4th STEP

- Contactor Builds system
- Union County Environmental Health Office conducts inspection and gives approval when and if the system is installed correctly
- Union County Environmental Health Office sends homeowner letter that system has been approved and a drawing on installed system. Also adding in system care instructions.
